## ACHIEVEMENTS OF STUDENTS

Our school has been placed in the top 10% of schools, for the performance of the students in KRUU-Rhapsody, a project-based learning initiative from top universities to schools, spear-headed by Dr Anil Srinivas. 109 students' projects have been placed in the Eminence Class.



The school received a special mention from Gandhi Study Centre for encouraging the maximum number of students to appear in the examination which was based on Gandhiji's autobiography, "The Story of My Experiments with Truth", in November.

Our school students actively participated in Karuna activities during the academic years 2019 to 2022. The school was honoured for the students' efforts at the South Regional Karuna International Conference at Anna Nagar, Chennai, in December.

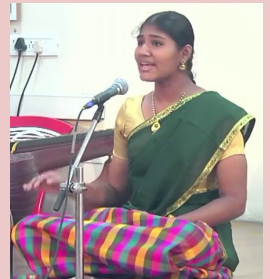

## OLYMPIADS



In the International Science Olympiad (ISO), 145 students across Std III to XII won gold medals of Excellence in the Science Olympiad. Vishvajit A of Std XI and Gokhul M of Std XII won Gold medals and Certificates of Distinction.

The SOF International Mathematics Olympiad was conducted in November. 142 students were awarded Gold Medals of Excellence. Muthu Madhav N of Std IV, U V Sarvesh of Std V and Gokhul M of Std XII were awarded Medals of Distinction.



In the International English Olympiad (IEO), 110 students across Std III to XII qualified for level 2 of IEO. Shankar R of Std VI secured the seventh rank at the zonal level and won gifts worth Rs 500 and a Certificate of Zonal Excellence. Devaang P of Std X secured the fourth rank at the zonal level and won gifts worth Rs 500 and a Certificate of Zonal Excellence. Arundathi S of Std XII secured the ninth rank at the international level and won a cash award worth Rs 5000, a Zonal Gold medal and a Certificate of Zonal Excellence. Nandini P of Std XII secured the third rank at the zonal level and won a cash prize of Rs 1000, a Zonal Bronze medal and a Certificate of Zonal Excellence.

In the International Social Studies Olympiad (ISSO), Ekalavya of Std III secured the third rank at the regional level and second rank at the zonal level of the International Social Studies Olympiad. He also won a cash prize of Rs.1250. P Raghav of Std III secured the sixth rank at the regional level and the third rank at the zonal level. He won a cash prize of Rs 1000. K G Karthik Swaminathan of Std X secured the third rank at the zonal level and the fifty-seventh rank at the international level. He won a cash prize of Rs 1000. S Sreyas, Devaang P and Lakshana Venkatakrishnan of Std X secured seventh, eighth and tenth rank respectively at the zonal level. They won a cash prize of Rs 500 each.

In the International GK Olympiad (IGKO), Ramanan Vasan of Std VII, Vybhav Shiv of Std VII and Yashashri Sankar of Std X secured the first zonal rank and received gold medals. S Sunita Kanthi of Std X secured the third zonal rank and received the bronze medal.

The Green Olympiad was conducted online in October. Participation certificates were given to all the students by The Energy Research Institute (TERI).

Students from Std VI to X took part in the Tamil Olympiad examination which was the first of its kind, conducted by Humming Bird Education Limited, in November. 27 students were awarded gold, silver and bronze medals for their exemplary performance.

SANMUN 2022 was hosted in October. Mr Shivkumar Eashwaran, Honorary Consul General to South India of the Republic of Armenia was the Chief Guest. Around 210 students participated from 26 city schools. There were 6 committees, including the

## EXONS 2022

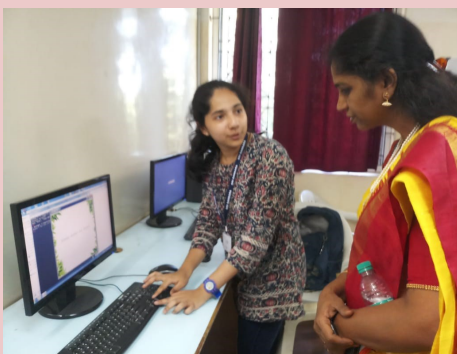

## TEACHERS' WORKSHOP

The Indian Education Trust (IET) conducts several workshops for the teachers of all three schools under the trust. In February, English and Geography teachers attended a workshop on 'Interdisciplinary Learning' conducted by Dr Saraswathi Ragunathan and Dr Lalitha. In April, teachers from various departments attended the workshop on 'Experiential Learning'. The workshop was conducted by Mrs P N Sundari. Workshops were also conducted in 'Teaching Strategies in Science' and 'Teaching Strategies in Math' for primary teachers handling Science and Math respectively by Mrs Hemamalini Balasubramanian and Mrs Rajeshwari.

Teachers attended nearly 301 online capacity building programmes conducted by CBSE on various topics like 'Salient Features in NEP', 'Embracing Multilingualism in Classroom', 'Practising Blended Learning', 'Art Integration Across Curriculum', 'Strengthening Reading Competency', 'Developing Resilience in Students,' etc.

The Principal, Mrs Mita Venkatesh conducted a workshop for English teachers in middle school on the teaching of grammatical concepts, in April.

Dr Padmanbhan Seshaiyar addressed the teachers of Sri Sankara School, Sankara Matriculation and KSN, in February, on 'Enhancing Pedagogical Practices by Integrating Computational Thinking into the Curriculum'. He explained briefly, the ways of teaching certain concepts using questioning to kindle the students' thinking; using pictorial representations of the problem; modelling a problem, etc. He insisted on 'Learning by Doing' to develop 21<sup>st</sup> Century skills of critical thinking, creativity, communication and collaboration. He touched upon active learning pedagogies such as notice-wonder, experiential learning, inquiry and project-based learning.



Wonder Exercise Session was conducted by Madras Dyslexia Association, in March. The resource person Ms Sanskruthi, enlightened the primary teachers on incorporating the sensory motor exercises in the classroom activities.

The Financial Literacy Training Session was conducted by CBSE, in April. It was attended by 37 teachers. The resource person Bhavani Pannerselvam, Certified Financial Planner, familiarised the teachers with best practices of general investment and post-retirement investment planning.



The school organised a workshop for the teachers on the topic 'Digital Disruption' in April. Sukumar Rajagopal, an alumna, was the resource person.



## STUDENTS' WORKSHOP

The students of Std VII visited 'Vitasta 2023', a festival celebrating the spirit of Kashmir, at the Kalakshetra Foundation, in January. The Vitasta festival was presented as part of 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav' by the Ministry of Culture, Govt of India, to provide a glimpse of the river 'Vitasta' currently known as Jhelum. The students witnessed stage performances of classical and folk dances, a craft bazaar and other activities. They visited the weaving stall where a giant handloom was displayed and saw various ways of printing on cloth. Stalls that showcased the crafts of Kashmir included embossed boxes, clothes and jewellery.





Dr. Padmanbhan Seshaiyar addressed the students of Std IX about computational thinking. He emphasised the significance of failure, critical thinking, collaboration and creativity, during the learning process. He encouraged the students to take up a problem in the neighbourhood, connect it to UN- SDG and try to analyse and arrive at a solution and implement it.

Mr Sadagopan Rajesh, addressed the students of Std IX and XI on 'Beautiful Mathematics', in February. He discussed some non-routine problems and puzzles. He explained how to identify the pattern in a sequence. Students actively participated and interacted during the session.

Selected students from Std IX to XII participated in a lecture demonstration conducted by Kalaimamani Dr Sunder, Sriram Parasuram and Dr Ghatam Karthick at Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Mylapore, in October.

RISHS International School conducted the National Science Invention fair in December. Vakula Bhushan R, Sahana A of Std VIII and H Akhilesh, S Shri Aravindh of Std IX presented their projects. The chief guest for the event was Dr Mylswamy Annadurai, former ISRO President.



## DIGITAL TRANSFORMATION

The digital transformation committee consisting of alumni, the Principal, the Vice Principal, teachers and the IT consultant has been set up as a long-term solution to bridge the learning gap during pandemic and also to digitise many of the internal processes for easy administration. Key features include, creation of content repository, BOTS creation to automate certain ongoing processes like reminders for workshops, watermarking of documents, update on fee defaulters, etc. Its an ongoing process leading to school's own learning management system.
