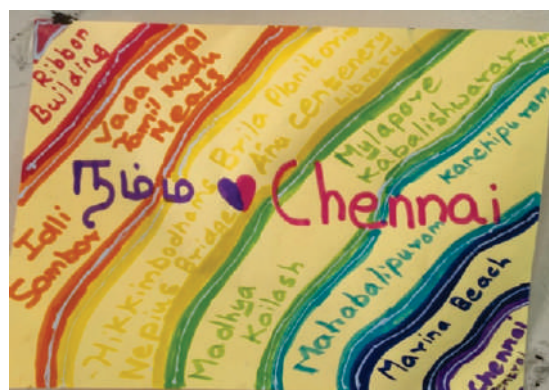
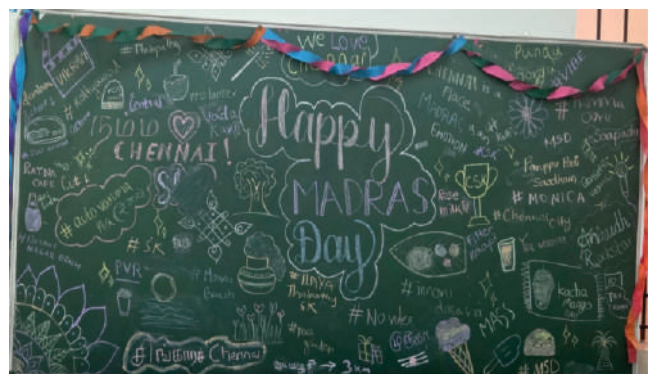
Four Way Film Workshop

Kurukshetra – A War Between Dharma and Adharma

"Yada yada hi dharmasya glanir bhavati Bharata Abhyutthanam adharmasya tadatmanam srijamy aham..."

These verses from the Bhagavad Gita were spoken by Shri Krishna to Arjuna on the battlefield of Kurukshetra, when Arjuna, overwhelmed by the thought of fighting his own kin, refused to battle. Krishna, his charioteer, revealed his Vishwaroopam—the divine cosmic form—and reminded him that He is the creator and destroyer, the embodiment of life, death, dharma, and adharma.

The Kurukshetra war, fought during the Dvapara Yuga, was a conflict between two branches of the Kuru dynasty—the Pandavas and the Kauravas—over the throne of Hastinapur. The Pandavas, sons of King Pandu, were led by Dharmaraj Yudhishtira, while the Kauravas, sons of the blind King Dhritarashtra, were led by Duryodhana.

When peace negotiations failed, war became inevitable. The Kauravas' side included mighty warriors such as Bhishma, Dronacharya, Kripacharya, Karna, and Duryodhana's brothers. The Pandavas had strong allies and, above all, the guidance of Shri Krishna, the incarnation of Lord Vishnu in that age.

The reasons for the war were many—Draupadi's humiliation, Duryodhana's jealousy, and failed attempts at peace—but ultimately, it was destiny, born of karma and divine will. The eighteen-day battle shattered all codes of duty and justice, leaving the land soaked in the blood of countless warriors. The Pandavas emerged victorious, but victory came with immense loss—Bhishma, Drona, Karna, Abhimanyu, and Ghatotkacha all fell.

After the war, Yudhishtira questioned the worth of ruling over a kingdom steeped in grief. Even Dwaraka, Krishna's own realm, later sank beneath the sea after His departure from Earth.

The Kurukshetra war is not just a tale of conflict but a reflection of the eternal struggle between dharma (righteousness) and adharma (injustice). It reminds humanity that both good and evil coexist, and that following one's dharma, despite hardship, leads to moksha—liberation.

As declared in the Bhagavad Gita: "Whenever adharma rises and threatens to destroy humanity, Lord Vishnu descends to restore dharma and cleanse the world."
